## Community benefits:

The villagers – the guides, host families, handicraft cooperatives – receive fair wages as stipulated by the Community-based Tourism Committee. Andaman Discoveries ensures that the majority of the money generated by each tour goes directly to the villagers. A portion of guests' in-village costs are donated to the community fund that is managed by the villagers. The fund provides financial support for community initiatives and projects in the village. This creates concrete economic opportunities for the villagers, who may otherwise have to seek employment outside of the village.
