After that relax with two hours of traditional Thai massage, plus cruise the waterways around Ayutthaya on a traditional converted teak rice barge, taking in the incredible sights of the city.

Drifting along the river you will pass the following famous monuments as you enjoy your freshly prepared Thai cuisine.
