## 1 Day Tour - Koh Surin

Trip summary	1 days Koh Surin Tour.
Getting there	Tour starts and ends in Kuraburi, Phang Nga.
In-country support	Tour guide
What's included	Transfer to/from pier, activities, National Park fee, snorkeling gear and lunch
Availability	Available from November 1 to April 30 (National Park closed May-October)

*Koh Surin National Park is a paradise of fine white sandy beaches, thick jungle, crystal-clear waters, and some of the best coral reef in Thailand. It is also home of the Moken, a traditionally nomadic sea people who have lived in harmony with nature along Thailand's Andaman coast for thousands of years. More recently, the Moken have faced challenges of modernization, and are now open to sharing their way of life with respectful visitors in order to protect their culture.*

### Day 1 – Turquoise Bays and Corals Reefs

Early morning pickup from accommodation, transfer to Kuraburi Pier and transfer by speedboat to Koh Surin National Park.

At the island enjoy snorkeling and some marine exploration where you have the chance to see a variety of Marine life. You will visit several sheltered reefs, which are shallow and teeming with parrotfish, clownfish, and brightly colored soft coral. Have lunch at the National Park Head Quarters (NPHQ).

After lunch snorkel and discover the abundance of coral reefs and some rare fish not found anywhere else. Spend the afternoon immersed in the underwater world.

Moken Village visit- either before/after lunch depending on ocean tide. Please follow our Moken in village guide so you are respectful guests.

Transfer back to Kuraburi by speedboat. Arrive in Kuraburi to end your program; arrival time is approximately 4:30 PM
